SAC Member Seth discussed the formation of SUPER (Student Union for Political Expression and Representation). Each high school will have three representatives, one senior, one junior, one any grade, to be elected by students. Its goal is to serve as a platform for students to have their voices heard, and culminate action, with a focus on political issues. It is currently in the formation stage. It needs to be nonpartisan. To be effective, it is important to gain legitimacy as a group. The official launch will be in the 2018-2019 school year.

The Committee did not discuss Connection time due to the unavailability of an expected visitor to the meeting, and also the item was discussed at the last SAC meeting.

Dr. Lucero stated she would like to come regularly to the BOR Education Committee meetings to give the representatives updates. She discussed the BOE reorganization. The purpose of the reorganization is to separate the operational and the instructional sides of Stamford Public Schools. Dr. Lucero discussed the SPS vision of “mind, body, heart” development. It was discussed that public relation strategies are needed to get the word out about all the good things going on within the schools, to combat the negativity because people often do not have the right information. Dr. Lucero plans to develop “one-pagers” for the community that list short facts about the schools. The Education committee will come up with a list of topics that Dr. Lucero can address each time she meets with the Committee.
