- Increase capacity of the department through crosstraining of staff and utilizing seasonal workers
- Improving and increasing access to Fix It Stamford through language translation services

Economic Development





Accomplishments:

- Focused on Mayor's economic development priorities: innovation, business retention, business attraction
- Launched Global Stamford initiative with the Foreign Trade Commissioners
 Association representing 100+ countries and cities to spur global business attraction into Stamford
- Launched and actively engaged Mayor's Business Advisory Council with top 20+ corporate employers
- Small Business Resiliency Grant allocation approved by Board of Representatives and will kick off application process April 2023
- Conducted ongoing engagements with the City's top employers as well as small business owners throughout the City to promote business retention and job retention
- Conditional award for Innovation Corridor \$50 million grant from DECD
- Business Expansion Highlights:
 - Financial service sector growth and expanded footprint included expansion of Webster Bank following its merger with Sterling National Bank; Financial technology company, Mirador relocated its headquarters from Darien to Stamford. Financial services firm, Stifel, announced opening an office and creating 50 jobs
 - Over a dozen small business openings; retained 100+ restaurants and retail in Downtown Stamford with approx.
 90%+ occupancy rate

Challenges

- Macro-economic climate for large employers including staffing reductions and potential reduced real estate footprint
- Commercial vacancy rates reflect impact of COVID and shifting work landscape
- Inflation and labor shortages affecting corporates and small businesses
- Workforce attraction challenged by limited affordable housing
