Jim Hricay told the committee that at this point they are projecting a year end excess of revenue over expenditures of about \$300,000 for the General Fund and the BOE is projecting revenues over expenditures of about \$1,700,000. This is based on strong showings in receipt of funds from FEMA, conveyance taxes, building permits, and state grants that were not anticipated during the preparation of the budget for 2013-14. These strong performances are being offset by police and fire overtime, Smith House and a few other items coming in over budget. He said he does not expect an excess of revenues over expenditures near the amount experienced for 2012-13.

Chair Fountain adjourned the meeting at 9:00 p.m.
