The Fiscal Committee met at the above time and place. In attendance were Chair Fountain, Vice Chair Cerasoli and Committee Member Reps. Coleman, Day, DeLuca, Di Costanzo, Fedeli, Figueroa, Kooris, Mitchell and Silver. Also present were Reps. Reeder and Zelinsky; Lee Berta, OPM; Karen Cammarota, Grants; Terri Drew, YSB; David Yanik, Controller and Anne Fountain, Director of Health.

Chair Fountain called the meeting to order at 7:00 pm.

Terri Drew explained that this grant is to permit Stamford Youth Services Bureau to serve as Local Interagency Service Team for the Stamford Superior Court for Juvenile matters catchment area and allow coordination among the towns that are served by the juvenile court. It is a 3 year grant with a possible 2 year extension. This program focuses on the harm done by the juvenile and the opportunities to repair that harm. There are over 50 agencies involved with this program. A motion to approve this item was made, seconded and approved by a vote of 11-0-0. (Reps. Anne Fountain stated that this grant helps offset the costs of a seasonal employee for the Access Health CT enrollment. 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Anne Fountain explained that some funding was cut last year, although they are serving the same number of clients. The State gave additional funding on the condition that the City expand its services. This also offset the City contribution. Ms. Fountain will provide the committee with budget information showing what has changed. A motion to approve this item was made, seconded and approved by a vote of 11-0-0. (Reps. Karen Cammarota explained that this grant permits the police to recruit 16 an d17 years to attempt to purchase tobacco products (with police nearby). Each establishment will be visited 4 times. This program will last for a year. The gift cards will be the stipends for the recruits. She will get more information on how this works. A motion to approve this item was made, seconded and approved by a vote of 9-0-2. (Reps. Fountain, Coleman, Day, DeLuca, Di Costanzo, Fedeli, Kooris, Mitchell and Silver in favor; Reps. Lee Berta stated that this money was set aside in the contingency at the beginning of the year because the City wasn't sure what their responsibilities would be for the building. Two tenants of the building pay rent, which rent is included in the budget. This funding is to maintain the building. Committee members expressed concerns about whether the City was going to try to find an entity to operate a community center in the building.

A motion to approve this for two months, in the amount of \$35,000, was made, seconded and approved by a vote of 11-0-0. (Reps. Fountain, Cerasoli, Coleman, Day, DeLuca, Di Costanzo, Fedeli, Figueroa, Kooris, Mitchell and Silver in favor.)

The Committee would like the Operations Department to come and present its plans for the building prior to approving any additional funding.

David Yanik explained that the Board of Finance had chosen Blum, Shapiro through the RFP process. The first year fee is \$190,000 and the fee increases by about 3% each of the next two years. It is not unusual to change auditors every 5 years.
