Mr. Handler noted that the goal is not to be burdensome to outside agencies, but to protect the City's interests and to support the agencies and help them develop appropriate controls5. He noted that there is not City staff to do internal audits on all outside agencies. The City already has the ability to obtain this information from agencies that have leases with the City, although only to obtain financial information once a year.

Mr. Jessa and Ms. Greene reviewed the <u>attached handout</u>, regarding the applicants for the Senior Citizen Tax Abatement under the pilot program and the comparison to prior years. Committee members suggested that:

- The tax credit be clearer on the tax bill in the future
- The report have more breakdowns, such as credit by income category
- Changing the requalification requirements of the program so that applicants can requalify every other year

Mr. Hricay explained that the City has been increasing the portion of the ARC for OPEB contributed by the City 10% each year. Last year was 80% and for the 2015-16 fiscal year it will be 90%. Last year Mr. Woolacott did a full valuation. Mr. Woolacott reviewed the <u>attached report</u>, including the assumptions used in the OPEB valuation, highlights of the valuation and the Annual Required Contribution. The ARC contribution is lower than in 2012, but the City is funding a greater percentage. The ARC numbers are somewhat lower than what was budgeted.

Mr. Handler explained that this refunding resolution is the result of hard work by the WPCA and City staff with outside consultants. The refunding bonds are revenue bonds which are backed by the Authority's user-rates. With respect to the refunding opportunity, the City is refunding the 2006 revenue bond issue which has an average coupon for the remaining bonds of 4.63%. The proposed true interest cost (TIC) on the new refunding bonds is 3.44%, resulting in total budgetary savings of approximately \$1.4 million and total present value (PV) savings of approximately \$1.0 million. All of the proposed savings are recouped equally over the remaining life of the bond issue and there is no extension of maturities.
