The Fiscal Committee met as indicated above. In attendance were Chair Di Costanzo, Vice Chair Cerasoli and Committee Member Reps. Coleman, Coppola, Day, Fedeli, Figueroa, Miller and Silver. Also present were Jay Fountain, OPM Director; Jennifer Calder, Director of Health; Terry Drew, Youth Services Bureau; Karen Cammarota, Grants Officer; Ellen Bromley, Social Services Director; and Ted Jankowski, Director of Public Safety ,Health and Welfare.

Chair Di Costanzo called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.

Ms. Cammarota explained that these resolutions authorize the Mayor to sign contracts and contract amendments. Many of these contracts are multi-year contracts, so the resolution is prepared in case the contract is amended. The State often asks for a new resolution. These grant funds are part of the Special Revenue budget.

The City is entering into year 1 of this contract. Dr. Calder explained that Yale is the regional fiduciary for the health care coalition created by the CDC. A motion to approve this resolution was made, seconded and approved by a vote of 7-0-0 (Reps. Di Costanzo, Cerasoli, Coleman, Fedeli, Figueroa, Miller and Silver in favor).

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Ms. Cammarota stated that this was formerly known as the Cost Sharing Grant. The entitlement is based upon the City's population (per capita grant). The funds are used at

the discretion of the Health Director. The City match is not required by the State, but is the additional cost needed to run the programs covered by the grant. A motion to approve this resolution was made, seconded and approved by a vote of 9-0-0 (Reps. Di Costanzo, Cerasoli, Coleman, Coppola, Day, Fedeli, Figueroa, Miller and Silver in favor).

Ms. Cammarota stated that this contract runs through 2020. Dr. Calder noted that it supports a full time nurse who monitors immunizations of young children and provides immunization outreach. A motion to approve this resolution was made, seconded and approved by a vote of 9-0-0 (Reps. Di Costanzo, Cerasoli, Coleman, Coppola, Day, Fedeli, Figueroa, Miller and Silver in favor).

1d. <u>F29.551</u> GRANTS RESOLUTION, authorizing the Mayor to enter into agreement with the Connecticut State Department of Public Health for <u>Preventive Health</u> <u>Services Block Grant</u>; amount of grant: \$34,617 (City match: \$0). 08/25/17 – Submitted by Mayor Martin

This is a federal grant award by the State DOH. It funds a part time health educator, skin cancer prevention and accreditation, based upon decisions made at the beginning of the grant. The contract runs through 2018. A motion to approve this resolution was made, seconded and approved by a vote of 9-0-0 (Reps. Di Costanzo, Cerasoli, Coleman, Coppola, Day, Fedeli, Figueroa, Miller and Silver in favor).

1e. <u>F29.552</u> GRANTS RESOLUTION, authorizing the Mayor to enter into agreement with the Connecticut State Department of Public Health for <u>WIC Nutrition</u> <u>Program</u>; amount of grant: \$919,310 (City match: \$28,863).

This is year 1 of a 5 year contract. This grant provides WIC assistance to children and pregnant women. The City subcontracts to Norwalk and runs a satellite office in Greenwich. The City match is to cover certain staffing levels that are required. Other cities contribute in kind. A motion to approve this resolution was made, seconded and approved by a vote of 8-0-0 (Reps. Di Costanzo, Cerasoli, Coleman, Coppola, Day, Fedeli, Miller and Silver in favor).

This is year 1 of a 5 year contract. This grant covers partial funding for a TB nurse, and STD nurse and a part time STD nurse, as well as supplies and training. After a discussion of recent TB monitoring and prevention activities, a motion to approve this resolution was made, seconded and approved by a vote of 9-0-0 (Reps. Di Costanzo, Cerasoli, Coleman, Coppola, Day, Fedeli, Figueroa, Miller and Silver in favor).

This grant is subcontracted to CLC and the contract runs through 6/30/18. A motion to approve this resolution was made, seconded and approved by a vote of 9-0-0 (Reps. Di Costanzo, Cerasoli, Coleman, Coppola, Day, Fedeli, Figueroa, Miller and Silver in favor).

2b. <u>F29.555</u> GRANTS RESOLUTION; authorizing the Mayor to Enter into an agreement with the State of Connecticut Department of Education for <u>School Readiness and</u> <u>Child Day care</u>; amount of grant: \$4,282,464 (City match: \$29,941). 08/25/17 – Submitted by Mayor Martin

Most of this grant is subcontracted to CLC & Rippowam programs. The state allows \$100,000 for administration services. A motion to approve this resolution was made, seconded and approved by a vote of 9-0-0 (Reps. Di Costanzo, Cerasoli, Coleman, Coppola, Day, Fedeli, Figueroa, Miller and Silver in favor).

This grant also gets subcontracted to Family Centers & All Our Kin to provide support services to school readiness and home daycare. A motion to approve this resolution was made, seconded and approved by a vote of 9-0-0 (Reps. Di Costanzo, Cerasoli, Coleman, Coppola, Day, Fedeli, Figueroa, Miller and Silver in favor).

The City is the fiduciary for this grant and receives \$50,000 to administer the grant as well as participating in the programs, such as training. This grant provides ½ of the salary for the Emergency Management Director and the Deputy Emergency Management Director. The City did a transportation survey and is currently reviewing this program to determine where it is needed and how best to provide the services. The amount is determined by a formula in the Zoning regulations and the money is returned to the housing programs.
