The Fiscal Committee met as indicated above. In attendance were Chair Di Costanzo, Vice Chair Miller and Committee Member Reps. Fedeli, Figueroa, Jacobson, McMullen, Nabel and Pendell. Absent or excused were Committee Member Reps. Coleman, Morson and Pia. Also present were Dr. David Woods, Land Use Bureau; Michael Handler, Director of Administration; and Dr. Tamu Lucero, Superintendent of Schools.

Dr. Woods discussed this resolution with Committee members as follows:

- This came out of the South End Neighborhood Study done last year. One of the ideas that came up was the possibility of repurposing the Lathon Wider Center.
- This grant would examine the center and the surrounding 4½ acres to determine if the center should be repurposed and to what end. DECD will work with the City to develop appropriate plans.
- There will be no cost to the City; he would manage the plan
- There is a separate grant for the South End Traffic Study; parking and affordable housing are also being reviewed separately
- The consultant would help with some of the implementation; the goal is realistic, with implementable ideas

Mr. Handler explained that this is an approval of the prior year (F17/18) fund balance. This allocation was originally proposed at the end of the last fiscal year, but the Administration held off in order to see how the year progressed. These amounts are the same as proposed then. The allocation for the Rainy Day Fund is set to keep the fund stable. The allocation for the Risk Management Fund is to address perceived liability based on heart and hypertension claims. This liability needs to be determined as a result of a change in the GASB rules. The allocation to the BOE/Short Term Capital is pursuant to a letter agreement between the City and the Board of Education. The rest goes to City/Capital Non-Recurring.

- The capital projects are under the purview of the Engineering Department; the City will remain involved in the maintenance
- The schools also need long term plans for their facilities

- There is also a plan to do a full Asset Management Inventory to properly understand what exists at each facility for routine maintenance and asset replacement planning
- The Mold Task Force (Asset Management Group) will be making the majority of the decisions as to how funds should be spent; but there will be no bonding for projects without details

Mr. Handler reviewed with the committee how to find detailed information on the <u>Mold</u> <u>Task Force webpage</u>. He explained that the amount spent at each school, by vendor can be found.

- The costs incurred to date can be located at <u>MTF Costs Incurred</u>. This is updated periodically; the most recent update is <u>June 13, 2019</u>. This includes total spend as well as projected costs
- The work being done at each individual school can be found by clicking on the specific school and the spreadsheet headers will be fixed so in place when scrolling down the sheets

The City is involved in the plan for facilities use, but can't interfere with educational programming; that is the domain of the Board of Education; City employees are working with the BOE on facilities management

Dr. Lucero explained that she met with many facilities managers, but felt that the City's management would be in the best interests of the students.

• The Asset Management Group meets daily and reports to the Board of Education at least monthly; they report to her daily

The Asset Management Group will do an asset inventory of the entire district, in order to be able to plan for the future and learn from other schools

The money spent at Elmcroft consists of operating expenses

The Asset Management Group is hoping to come up with a plan and cycle for capital improvements.
