RE: Proposed Hoyt-Barnum House Relocation

In regards to the proposed relocation of the Hoyt-Barnum House, HPAC, at the July 7, 2015 meeting, has voted for the following additional recommendations that supplement our April 21, 2015 (attached) recommendations.

- 1. Due to concerns expressed at the June 30, 2015 Land Use Board Meeting by members of the public, HPAC, and other parties; HPAC recommends that the city prepare an addendum to the contract for the new police station to produce conceptual level site plan alternatives that investigate the feasibility of the retention of the Hoyt Barnum House in situ.
- 2. HPAC recommends that the Stamford Historical Society, with the city's assistance, explore the procurement of a grant for a feasibility study to ensure the continued use, future financial viability, and preservation of the Hoyt-Barnum House.
- 3. HPAC recommends that the future of the Hoyt-Barmun House be protected with a preservation easement to be monitored by the Connecticut Trust for Historic Preservation.
- 4. All recommendations contained in the HPAC April 21, 2015 memorandum (attached) still stand.
