PETITION

To: Zoning Board of the City of Stamford

We, the undersigned owners of the property within the city of Stamford affected by the approved as modified regulations, Application 222-01, known as Omnibus Text Changes Clean Up3 solidified by the Zoning Board, do hereby oppose and protest against the text amendment.

The Zoning Board has promulgated regulations inconsistent with the Master Plan. The Master Plan provides for the preservation and enhancement of Stamford's low and medium low density residential neighborhoods and the preservation of the existing land use character to protect neighborhood stability and protect property values. The proposed text changes could permit levels of development and density that could exceed, be incompatible with and be out of character with the surrounding residential neighborhoods.

Substantive changes were made to these regulations after the public portion of the meeting was closed and no further public comment could be made. The regulations permit conversions from commercial to residential use of existing conforming or legally non-conforming buildings, in whole or in part, as of right, (without a public hearing) except where the building is located in certain industrial districts. Additionally, these regulations would permit the modifications of any underlying zoning requirements administratively (without public hearings or input) including parking requirements (reduced by up to 20%), building height (increased by up to 1 story) and usable open space (reduced by up to 50%).

The Zoning Board has acted capriciously and wantonly, approving text changes to the Zoning Regulations that include provisions for use and excessive density that are presently under appeal (Application 221-20). The Board has demonstrated a blatant disregard for the public, contempt for the petitioners' right to appeal, the appeal presently pending, the decisions rendered by the Supreme Court of Connecticut which should have validated the referral of the previous petition, and Section C6-40-8 of the City Code of Ordinances, which states "The Zoning Board shall not hear any application or applications relating to the same amendment, or substantially the same amendment, more than once in a period of twelve months..." The Approval of the Zoning Board should be overturned and the voting Zoning Board members rebuked for their shameless behavior and conduct.

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



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
