Also present were Lou Casolo, Engineering; Melissa Mulrooney, Stamford Museum Executive Director; and Joyce Carwin, Dr. Yerwood's Granddaughter.

Chair Day called the meeting to order at 7:35 p.m.

### Mr. Casolo stated:

- Scope of the Work is from Stamford Museum Master Plan
  - New Farm House
  - o Entry way to the Farm House
  - Parking Lot Modifications
  - Water line installation
  - o Relocation of the Maple Sugar House
- Tai Soo Kim Partners will also be responsible for
  - Architectural work and Landscaping
  - Civil engineering
  - Carry out final construction documents
- 12 Firms responded
  - Contract negotiated down from \$525,000 to \$383,000
  - Fee also includes Construction Administration meaning when project into construction the architect will come to project meetings and fulfill requests for information
- · Tai Soo Kim is a firm that is sought after
- Stamford Museum has a balance of \$745,000.00 so this contract is covered

## Ms. Mulrooney stated:

- The City created a master plan for the Stamford Museum in 2008-2009 and this is a phase of this plan
- The plan was created to make improvements to give the greatest function to the community
- The Museum serves about 200,000 people a year (increased by 10% yearly)
- Over the past 6 years the Board of the Stamford Museum has looked at ways to tackle more
  affordable capital projects with the grace of City funding and the engineering department
- Ms. Mulrooney stated that since they are on the upside of the economy it is time to target the bigger projects
- Ms. Mulrooney anticipates construction to start later this year if this contract is approved.

A motion to approve this item was made, seconded and approved by a vote of 5-0-1. (Hoch, Okun, Patterson, Ryan and Summerville in favor; Day abstained)
