The Land Use-Urban Redevelopment Committee met as indicated above. In attendance were Chair Day and Committee Member Reps. Hoch, Okun, Patterson and Ryan. Absent or excused were Committee Member Reps. Heaphy, McGarry, McNeil and Summerville; Josh Benson, Transportation Bureau Chief; and Jackie Kaufman, Carmody Torrance Sandak Hennessey LLP.

Chair Day called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m.

Mr. Benson stated that the intersection of Greenwich Avenue and Pulaski is a problematical intersection. Almost everyone turns at the intersection. They are attempting to replace the intersection with a roundabout, which will create a better flow.

## Ms. Kaufman explained that

- The original application for this item was approved in 2009.
- This approval by the Zoning Board required public access. This condition was appealed by O&G as unsafe.
- This resulted in a negotiated settlement which provides for the roundabout. The road

- discontinuance accommodates the additional space needed for the roundabout.
- The City will convey 12,219 ft² to O&G and O&G will convey 26,453 ft² to the City under this settlement. The conveyance to the City will include park area, which will be an extension to the Mill River Park
- This is the 3<sup>rd</sup> phase in this plan, which will end with the property swap

Mr. Benson stated that the City is currently pursuing funds for the roundabout.

Chair Day pointed out that the project is designed to facilitate traffic flow in the area. Committee members discussed the plans for the reconfiguration of the area with Ms. Kaufman and Mr. Benson.

A motion to approve this item for public hearing was made, seconded and approved by a vote of 5-0-0 (Reps. Day, Hoch, Okun, Patterson and Ryan in favor).
