Chair Heaphy called the meeting to order at 7:06 p.m.

1. <u>LR29.080</u>	RESOLUTION; Approving the Assignment of a Tax Abatement Agreement Between The City Of Stamford And Forest City Sound View Associates to RAHF IV Shippan, LLC. 04/06/17 – Submitted by Mayor Martin	APPROVED 9-0-0

Mr. Rosenberg explained that this resolution is for the assignment of an existing abatement. Mr. McCarthy reviewed the attached <u>factsheet</u> describing the transaction. In response to questions from the Committee, he explained that this property will remain senior affordable housing and none of the current residents will lose their residences. Without any action, this property could go to market as market rate housing in 2020. The City receives 10% of the gross income of the property.

2. <u>LR29.081</u> ORDINANCE <u>for publication;</u> Concerning Relaxing Sec. 47-17; Requiring Contractors To Directly Perform 30% Of Public Works Projects.

Mr. Pollard and Mr. Dellaselva explained that this ordinance is a response to changes in practices within the construction industry and is outdated. For larger jobs, contractors are no longer able to self-perform 30% of the job. As a result, there is less competition and higher prices for jobs. Most contractors use subcontractors. Increasing competition reduces the cost of the jobs. Other towns and cities in Connecticut do not have this rule, but may require it on an individual basis in smaller jobs. This requirement could be included in bid documents.

Mr. Finkle stated that he is a professional estimator and has reviewed how contractors do their work. Most contractors can't meet this requirement and won't bid on a job. This mandate is costing the city money.

Eliminating this requirement completely would not affect the City entering into PLAs with contractors, in which the City negotiates with unions that labor for specified trades on a job is provided by union workers and the contractor agrees.

Mayor Martin stated that he would be happy to have this provision eliminated completely.

A motion to amend this ordinance to delete §47-17 was made, seconded and approved by a vote of 9-0-0(Reps. Heaphy, Coleman, Day, Mitchell, Nabel, Okun, Ryan, Silver and Zelinsky in favor).
