The Legislative & Rules Committee met as indicated above. In attendance were Chair Lee and Committee Member Reps. Fedeli, Jacobson, Lion, Miller, Nabel and Zelinsky. Chair Lee called the meeting to order at 7:07 p.m.

The Committee first took up Item No. 2. Chair Lee opened the public hearing. 33 members of the public spoke about the proposed ordinance. There being no further speakers, Chair Lee closed the public hearing.

Committee members discussed the proposed ordinance as follows:

- How many stores in Stamford sell products for pets; and how many have a history of sourcing animals from puppy mills
- Whether Safari Stan's is in violation or compliance with current state law
- Whether there is an issue of unintended consequences arising from the ordinance, such as an underground market in California and Maryland, which currently have state laws banning the sale of pets in pet stores
- That it might be appropriate to include a grace period or winding down process for current businesses

Chair Lee noted that the Board office had received an email from Director Emmett on Monday raising a possible preemption issue, and he had subsequently requested a legal opinion on this issue. Director Emmett stated that her office was working on this issue and had not yet reached a conclusion.

Committee members continued to discuss this item:

- If a company's business model is selling animals, whether they need to be given time to change their business model
- The issue is not the business in Stamford, but what happens to the animals before they reach the business

Chair Lee opened the public hearing on Item No. 1. There being no members of the public present wishing to speak, the public hearing was closed.

Mr. Dellaselva explained that the City turned the management of WIC over to Optimus last year and they had a license to move into the 8th floor. The expectation was that the lease would have been finalized earlier but was not and so is retroactive to the end of the license. The lease is for 1375 ft². Optimus is expecting to move out by December. The rent is not revisited for 5 years.

Rep. Zelinsky made a motion to hold Item No. 1, which did not receive a second.

Optimus is administering the WIC grant, so the City no longer pays those expenses.

Rep. Cottrell discussed her findings on the effect of straw bans on people with disabilities. She noted that straw bans with medical exemptions can put wait staff into the position of determining who has a disability and that the disabled community is not in support of medical exemptions. Norwalk has changed its proposed ordinance to an on-request policy, which is more inclusive but will result in the reduction of straw use
