## **Committee Report**

Date: Tuesday, January 28, 2025

**Time:** 7:00 p.m.

**Place:** This meeting was held remotely.

The Legislative & Rules Committee met as indicated above. In attendance were Vice-Chair Boeger and Committee Member Reps. Cottrell, Fedeli, Matheny, Sherwood, and Vandervoort. Also in attendance were Reps. Camporeale, de la Cruz, Summerville, and Walston; Dana Lee, Corporate Counsel. Absent or excused were Chair Phil Berns, Reps. Blank, and Pierre-Louis.

Vice-Chair Boeger called the meeting to order at 7:03 p.m.

Rep. Camporeale spoke about the executive order aimed at implementing measures to combat climate change and promote sustainability. In response, Resolution 4130 was introduced:

- Referred to as "skip the stuff," retailers are not allowed to automatically give customers single use plastic items.
- Retailers are not allowed to ask customers if they want a single use plastic item. The customer must ask.
- The single use plastic item must be made from compostable / biodegradable materials that are PFAS free and BPI certified.
- Facilities with "dine in" services must provide only reusable cups, bowls, dishes, trays, chop sticks, flatware, and ramekins.
- Stamford's recycling machinery is currently incapable of processing flatware-shaped items.

Corporate Counsel Lee elaborated on the constraints and potential actions related to the ordinance:

- The implementation period could take six to twelve months.
- Fines will range from \$150 to \$250.

Rep. Sherwood discussed the health impacts of using plastic:

- Microplastics affect almost every major organ system. Areas most studied are:
  - The gastrointestinal (GI) system
    - Negatively affects the balance of the gut microbiome.
    - Causes inflammation which could lead to cancer, rheumatoid arthritis, heart disease, and other serious illnesses.
  - The nervous system
    - Diminishes children's ability to learn.
    - Affects the memory.
    - Contributes to cognitive decline.
  - The endocrine system
    - Disrupts a woman's monthly cycle.
    - Causes infertility.
    - Affects a man's ability to produce testosterone.
- The average American consumes about five grams of plastic per week.

A motion to recommit Item 1 was made, seconded, and approved by a vote of 6-0-0 (Vice-Chair Boeger, Reps. Cottrell, Fedeli, Matheny, Sherwood, and Vandervoort in favor).

Vice-Chair Boeger adjourned the meeting at 8:17 p.m.
