Alan Fore from Kinder Morgan distributed the attached presentation and described the overall project and the expansion of the Tennessee Gas Pipeline system. The project has not yet been started, no permits have been filed for, no state or federal review has taken place, and no construction would begin before 2017. Jim Hartman explained the details of the proposed new pipeline parallel and adjacent to the existing pipeline in Stamford. The company has been in contact with the landowners who will be affected by the installation and have gotten survey rights but will also have to get additional rights to work on the properties. Eminent domain would be a last resort after approval of the project. There will be public community meetings for landowners and members of the public. In addition, FERC will hold public meetings.

Mr. Collins of Yankee Gas said the impact of this project will be to ensure an additional supply of natural gas for residents of Stamford. This should result in a lower cost supply.

Mr. Handler described the history of non-payment at the WPCA. The Board hired Computil to do billing in order to increase payments. The Board had to make a decision about people who fail to pay and who owe at least \$5000 and haven't made any payments. At this point the foreclosure procedure starts. Ms. Roca stated that this amount may be 5-10 years of non-payments. The WPCA does offer payment plans for people who can't pay. The Committee discussed the process used by the WPCA to handle late payments. The individual who fails to pay would be charged the legal fee for the collection.
