City Engineer Casolo provided an overview:

- The project is split between Engineering and Facilities departments.
- Engineering handles the mechanical aspects; Facilities manages finances, tenant relocation, and asbestos abatement in the boiler room.

- Engineering and Facilities collaborated on the bid document for boiler replacement design with CES.
- A public bid opening for the project will be tomorrow at 11am.

Deputy Director Carpanzano provided an update:

- The area for seating is expected to open within less than a month.
- The salad bar center island has been removed and cleaned up as part of preparations.
- The kitchen requires special appliances compatible with its specific utility lines.
- These appliances are currently on order but have not yet been received.
- Limited kitchen appliances make it challenging for the vendor to fully reopen the cafeteria for public service.
- Appliances are expected to arrive soon, enabling the cafeteria to return to its previous level of operation.

City Engineer Casolo provided a project update:

- Weekly progress meetings with the contractor are held every Tuesday at 10 AM.
- Construction of the bridge deck, a significant milestone, has been completed within a week, including formwork, rebar installation, and concrete pouring (April 17).
- The deck is currently curing, and reinforced concrete approach slabs (8 feet wide) are being prepared today.
- Concrete pouring is scheduled for tomorrow (April 28).
- The granite curb has been delivered and will be installed next.
- Formwork and reinforcement to follow curb installation, with subsequent pouring and parapet wall construction.
- A waterproof membrane will be applied to the deck before asphalt paving.
- A meeting with the Connecticut Department of Transportation (CONDOT) is scheduled

for next Tuesday to finalize paving plans

- The bridge is scheduled to open to traffic by May 15.
- Ancillary work (e.g., stone veneer, grading, topsoil, ornamental arches) will continue after opening.

City Engineer Casolo provided a status review:

- A meeting was held including residents from several neighborhoods (e.g., Loveland, Pepper Ridge, White Birch) and district representatives.
- An overview of the flood resilience grant funding the mitigation study was given.
  - Details about the FEMA flood hazard area impacting properties.
    - o Identifying cost-effective solutions for flood mitigation.
- "Walk Shop"
  - $\circ$  2–2.5-mile neighborhood walk with 7 strategic stops.
  - Stops focused on flood-prone areas where residents shared concerns.
  - Access agreements obtained from 20+ residents for consultants to conduct assessments on private properties.
- Next steps include data collection (culverts, streams, hydraulic modeling, etc.).
  - Development of computer models for existing conditions and concept-level alternatives.
  - Additional community engagement and future "walk shops" scheduled for late May.
  - Developing the flood resistance plan by December 2025.
  - A project website with resources and educational materials on flood hazard areas and FEMA maps will be available for residents.
  - QR code for residents to submit concerns, photos, and documentation directly.
