- As of August 5th, the project has officially been awarded.

Expansion of Ball Fields

Commissioner Hollis summarized the following:

 In January 2025, Michael Ojira (Stanford Stars Girls Softball League) presented a proposal to add a third rookie field at Troy Softball Complex.

- The proposal was supported by a \$30,000 grant from the New York Mets and the Steve Cohen Foundation.
- Commissioner Newman motioned to approve a feasibility study using the grant funds.
- The motion passed 3/1/0 (Tedder, Newman, and Pomerantz in favor; Hollas opposed; no abstentions).
- The proposed rookie field would be placed between the two existing outfields, utilizing the smaller size of a rookie field.
- Residents and Cove Island Wildlife Sanctuary representatives voiced opposition during public comment and via email.
 - Concerns included environmental impact and disruption to nearby natural areas.
- Lauren Meyer responded that the administration had not been approached and would not support the third field proposal.
