## Ms. Burwick explained that:

- She is currently working on transforming the present budget books, to make it easier to read and to start a dialogue
- She has not yet focused on performance metrics
- She has looked at other municipalities to determine best practices
- A number of municipalities do include performance metrics

## Jim Hricay explained that

They would like to tie the budget to performance metrics

Ms. Burwick reviewed the attached <u>budgets</u> for firefighting from other municipalities, which break out the budgets by programs.

- For example, the Norwalk budget breaks the budget into 4 programs (pages 2-8 of the handout), and contains projected metrics
  - Inputs would be the amount of money, and there are measures of outputs and effectiveness
- San Jose (pages 9-14) has a more detailed breakdown
- There must be a collaboration between the administration and the departments to get this type of data

- Bellevue, Washington (pages 15-23) includes a concept of community values, which determined performance indicators based on a community survey
- Next year's budget will contain additional information in order to tie funding to an output
- The budget will focus on performance metrics for 3 departments fire, technology and solid waste, and will be launched next March and will include some of this; wanted to select manageable programs which have the ability to measure currently
- The focus will be on getting the budget done, rather than performance metrics, at this point but gathering thoughts on inputs and outputs is important and moving toward year-over-year metrics is our goal.

Several members of the committee expressed that they would like to see community surveys considered in the future - find out what communities care about and relate key performance metrics to citizen perception.

Chair Di Costanzo asked Ms. Burwick & Mr. Hricay to consider including performance metrics for outside agency budgets in addition to their 3 targeted department budgets.

Chair Di Costanzo adjourned the meeting at 6:45 p.m.
