ORDINANCE NUMBER 1178 SUPPLEMENTAL CONCERNING AMENDMENT TO RESIDENCY POINTS FOR ENTRY LEVEL POLICE EXAMINATIONS

WHEREAS, it has been determined that it is in the best interest of the City of Stamford and the Stamford Police Department to recruit entry level police officer candidates who reside in the City of Stamford; and

WHEREAS, The Board of Representatives has determined that one method to aid in such recruitment is to award residency points to the civil service examination score.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF STAMFORD THAT:

Chapter 49 (Police Department), Section 49-4, of the City of Stamford Code of Ordinances shall be amended as follows:

Sec. 49-4. Entry level examinations.

- Five (5) bonus points shall be added to the final earned score of Stamford residents who pass the <u>entry level</u> Police examination—to-be-administered in the years 2008-2009.
- 2. In order to be eligible for the award of <u>these</u> bonus points, a candidate must submit irrefutable evidence to prove that he or she has been domiciled in Stamford for at least the twelve (12) months prior to the date of receipt of application for the <u>entry level</u> Police examination. Further, the candidate will be required to sign a sworn affidavit attesting to the fact that he/she has been domiciled in the City of Stamford for the required period prior to the date of submission of the application. Said proof must be provided to the City's Human Resources Division at the time of application.
- 3. For purposes of this section, "domiciled" is defined to be "that place where an individual has his/her true, fixed and permanent home, where he or she normally eats and sleeps and maintains his or her normal personal and household effects."
- 4. As administrator of the <u>entry level</u> Police examination, the Director of Human Resources, will develop, promulgate and enforce the procedural methods and requirements for the application and awarding of residency points, including any appropriate penalties for the submission of false information. The decision of the Director of Human Resources in all related matters shall be final.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that this Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon approval.
