The Public Safety & Health Committee met as indicated above. In attendance were Chair DePina, Vice Chair Quinones and Committee Member Reps. Caterbone, Moore and Zelinsky. Absent or excused were Committee Member Reps. Adams, Coppola, Kolenberg and Giraldo. Also present were Reps. Cerasoli and Heaphy; Michael Pollard, Chief of Staff; Ted Jankowski, Director of Public Safety, Health and Welfare; Ernie Orgera, Director of Operations; Kathryn Emmett, Corporation Counsel; and Lou Casolo, Engineering Bureau; Annie Taylor, Animal Control Task Force member; and Carol Ann McClean.

Chair DePina called the meeting to order at 7:10 p.m.

Mr. Jankowski explained that:

- The Task Force has worked with Police Department as far as procedures
- The Website is up to date with the latest information (Videos, Minutes, etc...)
- Added Animal Control Center Volunteer Coordinator (Interim basis)
- There are 18-20 Volunteers
- Posted for Animal Control Center Manager
- Center is being run more efficiently

Ms. Heaphy explained: (Deliverables for Stamford Animal Control Center Task Force)

- Task Force has had 7 meetings (one public hearing)
- Communicated with other municipalities for input
- Communicated with the State head of Animal Control
- Established a new volunteer policy

- Established a new policy for pet adoption
- Focus is to revise the City Ordinance and/or Policy

- Visited 6 sites
- Accessed each site by a scoring system including (City owned, size, area, Zoning etc.)
 - Haig Avenue (City Owned)
 - Vacant Lot (Off High Ridge Road)
 - Stamford Nature Museum
 - o Courtland Avenue (City Owned) (2012 considered most efficient)
 - 260 Long Ridge Road (Vacant property owned by BLT)
 - Existing site

Report Made

Mr. Jankowski explained:

- Informal meeting with OSHA regarding their Citations
 - Mr. Jankowski, Kathy Emmett, Michael Pollard, Both police chiefs and union representatives attended this meeting
- The City was cited with one (1) offence in seven (7) different areas
- They Able to bring fines down from approximately \$2700.00 to \$1600.00 because of compliance
- Abatement period has been extended for 6 out of the 7 items until January 5, 2015
- Monitoring the air quality of ACM quarterly
- Looking for a new location
- OSHA did test and found lead in the water on one site and the water has been shut off; Health Department continues to monitor the water

Mr. Pollard explained:

- Mayor Martin met with OSHA in late September regarding these issues
- Confirmed with OSHA that a likely conclusion to this would be to not touch ACM areas making the whole building to be potentially asbestos contaminated
- The air quality is well below any level of health risk as long as nothing is being disturbed
- Required to do ongoing monitoring on the air quality
- Formal response due on Monday November 24, 2014
- Priority is to make sure workers are safe
- Suggested the Board of Representatives do a Sense of the Board Resolution to commit to a new building
- They must clean up the asbestos in the building by March
- January Deadline is for training and informing vendors that there is asbestos in the building; notification of variety of different groups

 Trying to avoid an interim move; pursuing one move; Actively been looking for a location since the summer

Mr. Emmett explained:

- Resolution is to agree to not go above the drop ceiling ever and have quarterly monitoring
- No individual has been tested for any ailments
- OSHA's citation had to do with the ACM being disturbed and as soon as they were aware of this the air quality was tested and the air handlers were shut off; Air Quality was totally acceptable.

Ms. Emmett explained:

 This ordinance is to prohibit the use of demolition equipment other than for emergency work on Sunday in residential areas

Mr. Orgera explained:

- In some situations it is required to do demolition on a Sunday
- Normally demolition is during the week

A motion to approve this item was made, seconded and approved by a vote of 4-1-0. (Reps. Quinones, Caterbone, Moore and Zelinsky in favor; Rep. DePina opposed)

Mr. Zelinsky explained neighborhood issues with trucks running all day and possibly all night long. He explained that this is a quality of life issue for citizens of Stamford.

Ms. Emmett explained there is State support for this and the Connecticut law prohibits vehicles of all kinds from unnecessary idling for more than 3 minutes. There are also state regulations with exceptions.
