Vice Chair Quinones read the letter from William Hennessey with a recommended change to the ordinance. Mr. Warren explained that many state and municipal roadway activities occur at night. As there is increased development around their facility, an exemption for state and municipal roadway work will be needed. He noted that there have been no complaints against O&G in the past 7 years. The committee discussed whether this change is necessary. There being no quorum, no action was taken.

³3. PS29.024 ORDINANCE for publication; Proposed change to Sec. 164-6, Noise - to prohibit idling for more than three minutes.

Rep. Zelinsky distributed draft language revising this ordinance. He explained that this revision is to match the ordinance to the State limit of 3 minutes. He stated that this ordinance is for the benefit of 18 families. Captain Wuennemann noted that the current ordinance only applies to public streets, not the private property at issue here. There is a federal statute which is only enforceable by the State DEEP. There is an infractions ticket which City officers can write for school buses. The Police Department cannot prohibit idling on private property. Captain Wuennemann stated that there is no statute permitting the police to enforce this. This is a State DEEP regulation.

Mr. Loeb explained that although he is a member of the Harbor Commission, he is here as a member of the public. He detailed the instances of Styrofoam coming off 2 BLT buildings into the harbor and attempts to have it cleaned up. He stated that DEEP said it is a littering issue. Captain Wuennemann stated that he also saw the Styrofoam, on BLT's property. He noted that the one time he went down, BLT had put up nets to try to stop the Styrofoam. He sees this as a building department and DEEP issue rather than a littering issue, because this is an active construction site. The Committee discussed that this is a more appropriate issue for the Building Department to deal with it and inviting Bob DeMarco of the Building Department, BLT's chief engineer, Bill Buckley and the Law Department to meet about this next month.

Vice Chair Quinones adjourned the meeting at 8:10 p.m.
