Mr. Lee explained that this proposed change is the result of recent challenges to blight determinations because the current ordinance is not in accord with State law, particularly the requirement that the blight procedure be subject to the civil citation process, which would eliminate the substantive role of the blight committee. The Law Department determined that the ordinance needed to be revised and made more effective. Ms. Emmett noted that Rep. DeLuca had also asked that the ordinance be revised to clarify when the City may enter blighted properties to fix them. Mr. Lee stated that this ordinance is based on the New Haven ordinance and would eliminate the Blight Committee. These changes would ensure that property owners receive the notice and opportunity to be heard required by State law. In response to questions from the Committee, Mr. Lee noted that the composition of the Blight Committee would not be in consistent with State law. Rep. Ryan requested that the draft be amended to include a definition of dangerous to public health. A motion to hold this ordinance was made, seconded and approved by vote of 8-0-0 (Reps. DePina, Quinones, Adams, Caterbone, Coppola, Kolenberg, Moore and Zelinsky in favor.)
