Mr. Jankowski stated that the Stamford Police Department is trained in active shooter response and has a robust response capability. There were over 5500 school-based patrols last year. They performed school security assessments in 2010 and 2013 and are in process of one begun in 2017 and have identified infrastructure improvements.
