

The Steering Committee of the 31st Board of Representatives of the City of Stamford met on Monday, July 15, 2024 at 7:00 p.m.

MINUTES OF THE STEERING COMMITTEE

President Curtis called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.

In attendance were President Curtis and Committee Member Reps., Boeger, Cottrell, de la Cruz, Fedeli, Figueroa, Matheny, Moore, Morson, Patterson, Sherwood, Stella, Summerville, and Tomas. Absent or excused were Reps. Berns, Pierre-Louis and Roqueta. Also present were Rep. Adams.

President Curtis announced the committee changes as follows: Rep. Fedeli will be co-chair of the Fiscal Committee; New Member Jessica Vandervoort will be assigned to Fiscal, Legislative and Rules, and State and Commerce Committees; and the Outside Counsel and High Ridge Litigation Proposed Resolution Review Committees will be combined, and Representatives Camporeale and Grunberger will be added to this committee.

Representatives Cottrell gave an update on the new voting/sound system in the Legislative Chambers. She explained that the new software has different components and platforms involved. President Curtis and Clerk Cottrell has communicated with the Mayor’s office and IT for more involvement. It was realized IT needed to be more involved with this process. On the day of the board meeting all components being used that evening were tested including the Mayor attending to test for her State of the City.

Sammie Alemseghed, IT representative, added he did have to contact the vendor during testing, and they fixed the issue remotely. At the time of the board meeting the sound did not work for zoom. Sammie and other IT co-workers tested the program the next day with different user profiles, and everything worked properly.
