**SUMMARY OF PROPOSED ORDINANCE
AMENDING CHAPTER 231, ARTICLE III,
RESIDENTIAL PARKING PROGRAM**

This ordinance amends Chapter 231, Article III of the Code of Ordinances to make changes to the residential parking program including to:

- 1) require a fee of \$100 to accompany a petition for a residential parking permit area;
- 2) require the Transportation Bureau Chief to establish technical evaluation criteria for a designation of a residential parking permit area;
- 3) limit the number of residential parking permits per dwelling unit to no more than 3 at an annual fee of \$15 per permit;
- 4) permit pockets of time-restricted parking within a designated residential parking permit area through the use of signs or meters;
- 5) permit the Director of Operations to determine the number of visitor permits available per dwelling;
- 6) permit the creation of seasonal residential parking permits and planned temporary residential parking permits at a fee of \$15 per permit, emergency temporary residential parking permits at a fee of \$5 per permit;
- 7) permit residents to apply for special hardship residential parking permits for an application fee of \$40;
- 8) permit the expansion of existing residential parking permit areas; and
- 9) require the compliance with the revised ordinance by existing residential parking areas upon annual renewal.

This document is prepared for the benefit of the public, solely for purposes of information, summarization and explanation. This document does not represent the intent of the legislative body of the City of Stamford for any purpose.
