There was discussion on this item.

- The 120 hour violation is a Class II violation with a \$50 fine.
- Between January 2018 and June 2019 there were 848 citations handed out.
- Between May 1, 2018 and May 30, 2019 the City received \$12,750 from on-time violation payments, and \$19,375 from late payments.
- Many of the 120 hour violation citations begin with reports on Fix It Stamford.

- The procedure is as follows: After receiving a complaint, an enforcement officer goes out and takes a picture of the valve stem location, returns 120 hours later and if vehicle is still there, a \$50 citation is issued. After 24 hours if vehicle is still there, it is red-tagged for removal, the SPD is notified, and vehicle is towed.
- The numbers speak to the 120 hour ordinance being effective.
- Mr. Buttenwieser will break down the 848 violations by district and get back to the Committee.
