I. Welcome & Introductions

Karen Feder welcomed all and attendees introduced themselves.

II. Approval of Minutes

September and October 2019 Minutes were unanimously approved.

III. School Readiness Provider Reports October 2019

BOE at Rippowam and CLC Palmers, CLC Franklin, CLC Lathon, CLC Westover reports were provided to the SRC in advance of the SRC meeting for member review. Each Provider's reports are included here **Addendums A, B, C and D**. Reports include event information, pictures, attendance, staffing, special events, professional development, family engagement, diversity events, and events that include non-English speaking families.

IV. School Readiness Liaison Update – Donna Arcuri

- School Readiness Utilization- October 2019– BOE at Rippowam was down one slot due to a withdrawal of twins. Since then that slot has been filled. School Readiness Monthly Utilization Reports have been distributed and emailed to the SRC and are attached here as Addendum E.
- School Readiness Council parent participation Antonia Better-Wirz and Donna are scheduled to attend the CLC William Pitt ESL class to recruit parents for the SRC. Donna will also send a School Readiness Council invitation to parents that participate in the Parent Leadership Training Institute (PLTI) with children ages 0-5.
- 1st Quarter Liaison Monitoring for FY 19-20 was completed and reports emailed to the SRC membership. Reports were made available at the SRC meeting for review and are attached here as **Addendum F.**
- Classroom observation update It was reported that Kendra Brown will present the new Classroom Observation tool and present it to the SRC at the December meeting. Observations will occur during the winter months of 2019-20 and the report will be presented to the SRC immediately following.
- SRC policies- Fee policy will be presented next month with a revised fee calculation sheet. Additional policy changes. (Submissions, QSM education requirements, Quality Assurance etc. are forthcoming)
- CLC Maple Ave. The director for CLC Maple Ave. Nicole Clark Taxiltaridis resigned from CLC. I was informed that Anna Witkowski will be acting as the current Interim Director for CLC Maple until a new director has been hired. All appropriate forms have been completed and emailed to the OEC. SR funded classrooms are rooms 2,3,7 and 11.
- Unutilized slot report was distributed to the SRC and Providers via email. I will submit
 this at the end of this week once I have received responses. The SRC will be provided a
 completed copy via email.
- SRC meetings: In order to bring the integrated 0-5 CAN together with the SRC and include more center-based providers and parents, it was proposed that we try a new SRC meeting format that includes the 0-5 CAN during the second half-hour of our meeting of some SRC meetings.
- New SRC workgroups are forthcoming. Members were asked to contact Donna if they have a preference. 1. Education (Classroom Observations, SPED, Exclusions in the classroom, NAEYC surveys, RFP LEP review, etc.), 2. Fiscal (Expenditure report review, Monthly Reports, RFP budgets, etc.), 3. Policies (SR OEC policy compliance, Quality Component compliance, Policy updating, proofreading, etc.), 4. Community Outreach (EC Fair, Mental Health Consultant, website, etc.).

V. School Readiness Teaching Team Highlight- Beth Genovese and Linda Barge, CLC

- The teaching team from Room 7 at CLC Palmers Hill that is led by Luz Tsiralidisis the team The SRC chose to highlight. Luz and her team participated in the Fueling Families program that addressed food insecurity issues for children and their families. Luz and team were unable to attend the SRC meeting.
- Luz typically incorporates lessons in every area of the classroom and it was no different for the Fueling Families program.
- Beth and Linda displayed student experience photos and gave a detailed account of the lessons that the children learned and how this was delivered to the family.

- Photos demonstrated that this lesson was incorporated in every aspect of the classroom. In particular the dramatic play center, science center, literacy, art and music. Volunteers were also included in the lessons.
- Pictures were shared of the field trip to Fairgate Farms in Stamford where the students learned about the garden experience from seed to plant.
- Families shared photos of the home experience. Children went to the grocery store, used scales, and enjoyed the entire shopping for healthy food experience.
- Pictures were shown of the kids making and eating salads and fruits that they grew.
- The team helped parents understand that good nutrition is important for their children.
- Families received books and recipe cards to keep and use.
- A detailed project book with photos was shared with the SRC.
- This nutrition lesson covered the School Readiness Quality Components; Collaboration, Parent Involvement Education and Outreach, Health, Nutrition, Family Literacy, and Professional Development.

VI. Cradle to Career (C2C) Update – Tashi Shuler Drakes

- C2C has hired Data Manager Katherine Murphy and she will start with us on December 9th.
- The Lone Pine Foundation has assisted SC2C is coordinating training sessions in the community over the next several months with Jo Ann Freiberg (formerly of CT State Department of Education). A train the trainer session is also scheduled for January 5-7, 2020.
- Wednesday, November 13th CT StriveTogether Communities are hosting a regional conference in Bridgeport from 8:30-12:00 p.m. Jennifer Blatz, President and CEO of StriveTogether will be the keynote speaker and Dr. Tamu Lucero, Superintendent of Stamford Public Schools will be a featured panelist.
- Infant Health and Development CAN: Sparkler app pilot was launched with Children's Learning Centers, Family Centers, and St. Joseph's Parenting Center. 22 staff members were trained. 14 parents/caregivers have downloaded and started using the app for 19 children. Abilis and All Our Kin will begin within the next month or so. Child Guidance is no longer able to participate. The pilot will run through the end of March 2020. The goal is to reach 200 families.
- Infant Health & Development and Kindergarten Readiness Integration: The first integrated CAN meeting is scheduled for November 21st with a focus on developing goals and plans for three working groups. The new working groups are 1) Family engagement (includes GBYS), 2) Developmental Screenings/Assessments (includes ASQ, PKTS, and PELI), and 3) Professional Development (includes PreK-K PD).
- Kindergarten Readiness CAN: Prekindergarten Transition Summary (PKTS) data summaries will be provided for each Pre-School. Professional Development: On October 18th. Over 90 pre-school teachers from Children's Learning Centers visited 12 Stamford elementary schools and observed multiple Kindergarten classes each, reaching over 40 Kindergarten teachers and classrooms. The purpose was to experience and learn about

similarities and differences between the Pre-K and K environments and standards and to bring back ideas to augment the Pre-K experience. The CAN is working on another date for APPLES, private pre-schools and Family Child Care providers to visit Kindergarten classrooms. February 18th is tentatively set for Kindergarten teachers to visit pre-school classrooms. The CAN is still considering hosting an Early Childhood Dinner to include providers who serve children and families 0-5. Details will be shared once confirmed.

- Early Grade Reading CAN: Stamford Summer Literacy Initiative: The CAN hosted Tim Garvin, President and CEO of United Way of Central MA on Oct 17th. He presented on the Worcester Summer Literacy Initiative which has successfully reduced the phenomenon of "summer literacy slide". The Stamford Summer Literacy Initiative has a second component which includes a city-wide public awareness campaign to promote reading over the summer and drive enrollment in the Ferguson Library's Summer Reading Program.
- Transition from High School to Postsecondary, College and/or Career: Essential Skills
 Brochure: The brochure and pilot program were presented on October 25th at the Focus
 on Youth/LIST Meeting hosted by the Mayor's Youth Services Bureau. The CAN is in
 the process of building out provider supports including online access to resources, a
 learning community, and workshops.

VII. Kindergarten Information Nights – Kendra Brown

- Almost 200 families attended 11 events 3 daytime events at CLC and Building Blocks.
- Lower attendance than in the past however
- SPS Kindergarten Readiness page on the SPS website with the video presentation
- Community Open House was well attended.

VIII. Announcements and Adjourn
