

A Special Meeting of the Board of Representatives of the City of Stamford was held on Wednesday, April 14, 1954 pursuant to a call from the President, George V. Connors, at Burdick Junior High School at 8:00 P.M. *It was determined to adjourn the meeting at 10:10 P.M. as the Stamford Police Department was not present.*
The meeting was called to order at 8:15 P.M.

Roll Call was taken by the Clerk. There were 31 members present and nine absent. The absent members were as follows: Joseph Caputo, Karl Young, Jr., Martin H. Cash, Sr., Robert Lewis, Phil C. Coulter, Edward Ryba, Paul Plotkin, Stephen Kelly, and Dr. Dolan. Paul Plotkin arrived later.

The "Call" was read by the President.

I, George V. Connors, President of the Board of Representatives of the City of Stamford, pursuant to Section 202 of the Stamford Charter, hereby call a Special Meeting of said Board of Representatives for Wednesday, April 14, 1954 at Burdick Junior High School at 8:00 P.M. for the following purpose:

To receive the Operating and Capital Budgets 1954-1955 as transmitted by the Board of Finance by their letter of transmittal dated April 10, 1954, received April 12, 1954.

Please bring your copies of the Operating and Capital Budgets with you.

In accordance with Section 202 of the Stamford Charter, I hereby order that notice of the time, place and purpose of said meeting shall be served on each member of the Board of Representatives personally, or left at his usual place of abode at least 24 hours before the time fixed for such meeting by a member of the Stamford Police Department.

George Connors read the Resolutions submitting the Operating and Capital Budgets for 1954-1955 by the Board of Finance, and also stated that a letter was being distributed to each member for reference purposes. A copy of this letter is also on file in the office of the Board of Representatives.

George Connors then proceeded to transmit the figures of both budgets as presented by the Board of Finance.

The meeting was adjourned at 10:10 P.M.
