MINUTES OF MAY 9, 1979

SPECIAL BUDGET MEETING OF 15th BOARD OF REPRESENTATIVES

STAMFORD, CONNECTICUT

A Special Meeting of the 15th Board of Representatives of the City of Stamford was held on Wednesday, May 9, 1979 (to be adjourned to the following night, Thursday, May 10, 1979 to complete the work), pursuant to a "CALL" from the PRESIDENT, JOHN WAYNE FOX, in the Legislative Chambers of the Board, Second Floor, Municipal Office Building, 429 Atlantic Street, Stamford, Connecticut.

The meeting was called to order by the President at 8:30 P.M.

<u>PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE TO THE FLAG</u>: The President led the members in the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.

ROLL CALL: Roll Call was taken by the Clerk, Diane Raymond. There were 35 present and 4 absent; but by 8:40, two more members came in, with the attendance then becoming 37 present and 2 absent, one vacant seat with the resignation of Michael Morgan. The absent members were Mildred Ritchie, and George Hays.

The President declared a QUORUM.

CHECK OF THE VOTING MACHINE: The machine was found to be in working order.

"CALL" OF THE MEETING:

The following is the "CALL" of the meeting which was sent to all Board members and which President John Wayne Fox read:

"I, JOHN WAYNE FOX, PRESIDENT of the 15th Board of Representatives of the City of Stamford, Connecticut, and pursuant to Section 202 of the Stamford Charter, hereby call a SPECIAL MEETING of said Board of Representatives at the following time and place:

> WEDNESDAY, MAY 9, 1979 THURSDAY, MAY 10, 1979 at 8:00 P.M. in the MUNICIPAL OFFICE BUILDING Legislative Chambers, Second Floor 429 Atlantic Street Stamford, Connecticut

for the following purpose:

To consider and act upon the CAPITAL and OPERATING BUDGETS for the fiscal year 1979-1980, as transmitted by the Board of Finance on Wednesday, April 18, 1979, pursuant to provisions of Chapter 613 of the Charter of Stamford.

MR. FOX: There are just a few ground rules which I would like to set out before we begin. I would ask the members of the Board to keep in mind this Board lacks the power to restore any item that has been eliminated by the Board of Finance. We cannot restore anything taken away by the Board of Finance. During this meeting, as is the usual practice of Budget Meetings, there will be a continuing motion made by the Chairperson of the Fiscal Committee on behalf of the Fiscal Committee with their recommendations on the budget.

Keep in mind that the Fiscal Committee is making their recommendations to the full Board, and the final action is up to the full Board. If, as we go along, any member wishes to deny an item, to reduce an item, or restore an item that the Fiscal Committee recommends we reduce, he or she is free to make a motion to that effect, always keeping in mind that we can never reverse what has already been done by the Board of Finance.

In terms of the voting requirements for specific motions, let me make it clear at this time that all votes taken can be passed upon by a majority of those present and voting. Therefore, the only vote needed on individual items will be a majority of those present and voting. However, the vote on the final resolution which adopts the Capital and Operating Budgets which must be filed with the Town and City Clerk's Office, does need an affirmative vote of 21 members of the Board; all other votes are by a majority of those present and voting. I don't think that it is necessary for me to remind the members of the Board that the duty we have before us this evening is a very important one.

I would hope that you limit your discussions and conversations to the particular motion that you wish to make. I think we say as much to the people that elect us by the way we vote as much as by any philosophizing or extremely long comments that we may make on the floor of the Board.

With those ground rules and with that understanding, ^I would call upon Sandra Goldstein, Chairperson of Fiscal, and I would also point out that as Chairperson, one of the procedures that we have followed in the past is that we will give her discretion to proceed as she deems fit.

REPORT BY CHAIRPERSON OF THE FISCAL COMMITTEE - SANDRA GOLDSTEIN

SANDRA GOLDSTEIN: The Fiscal Committee of the Board began its Budget deliberations on Thursday, April 19, 1979. We heard fifty department heads support their budgets during the following two weeks. On Saturday, May 5, we met from 9:30 A.M. to 1:00 P.M. Sunday morning in a marathon sixteen hour session to arrive at the figure we present to you this evening.

Special thanks, and I really mean this right from my heart to a dedicated conscientious committee who worked endless hours on this budget: Mr. Rybnick, Mrs. Ritchie, Mrs. Hawe, Mr. Esposito, Mr. Flounders, Mr. Livingston, Mr. Hays, and Mr. Zelinski.

Next, our thanks to Frank Harrison, Budget Director who was present at every hearing we held. Also to Commissioner Hoffman whose excellent analyses of revenue projections and financial status reports aided us in our deliberations.

Finally, and absolutely not least, thank you very much Carmella Terenzio. Carmella worked endless hours typing and re-typing schedules and reports for this committee, our appreciation to Mrs. Terenzio and Judy Chasek for her thorough reports and re-search.

FISCAL COMMITTEE REPORT (continued)

MRS. GOLDSTEIN: (continuing)...Fiscal used the following rationale in its budget analyses and in determining cuts:

1) During this year of inordinately high inflation, the taxpayers pocketbook had to come first. Therefore Fiscal was determined to present a budget that would maintain but not expand city services.

2) Once again, Fiscal was adamantly opposed to artificial cuts, that would have Departments Heads returning for additional appropriations. Of the \$75,000 in cuts made by Fiscal and the Board of Representatives ast year only four cuts totalling \$85,000 have been reinstated. Our cuts this year were made with the same care.

3) In the area of City personnel, Fiscal approved ten of the eleven new positions passed by the Board of Finance. In addition we concur with the removal from the budget money for twenty-eight positions which have remained vacant for prolonged periods of time.

The City's Operating Budget exclusive of the Board of Education is 10.8% higher than last Fiscal year.

The Board of Education Budget has gone up by 5.6% because of the inclusion of teachers' and labor contracts in the Board's budget. The cost of the Education Budget as compared to the City's budget has gone up only 1.02%.

There is little doubt that the cost of operating this City has escalated considerably over the last few years. Fixed cost and contractual labor cost prevented Fiscal from cutting deeper than we did. Thus the recommendations before the Board tonight represent cuts designed to make the budget as lean as possible under existing conditions.

The real key to survival for this City will be determined by how well our municipal work force couples productivity with tighter budgetary practice.

The total City and Board of Education Operating Budget for Fiscal 1979/80 as recommended by the Fiscal Committee is \$99,284,817. This represents a \$834,692 CUT in the Budget given to us by the Board of Finance.

The Capital Projects Budget is \$11,990,613 which represents a CUT of \$519,430.

I would like to proceed with the Board of Education's Budget as our first order of business, which is on Page 429 of the Operating Budget.

OPERATING BUDGET 1979-1980 - BOARD OF EDUCATION - CODE 810.711- Page 429

MRS. GOLDSTEIN: Everyone has received a sheet with all the Board of Finance cuts. Those cuts I hope are now written in the column called Board of Finance. From the Board of Finance figure, Fiscal recommends a \$100,000 CUT, which would make the Board of Representatives total \$40,446,091. This was a most difficult cut for Fiscal to make, because the Committee believes that the Board of Finance had cut very deeply into the Board of Education Budget. I would like Mrs. Ritchie to explain the rationale behind the cut.

MRS. RITCHIE: Three factors are responsible for the higher school budget. Salary increases for Personnel, inflation, including higher cost for fuel and books, and the new program. The teachers are in the 3rd year of a three-year contract, which will pay 6½ more than last year, a raise of about 1.7 million dollars. Salaries make up about 75% of the operating budget. Inflation has added 11% to the cost of fuel bills, not to mention 31.9% overall increase in utilities and energy. Last year we spent \$535,000 on heat energy. This year's budget is projected at \$1,271.000 which is well over a 142% increase. With the decrease in student enrollment which is projected at 16,600 there will be a staff cut by eleven by attrition. Regular learning programs will lose 21 teachers while Special Education programs, Bi-Lingual and Learning Disables will pick up five and another four will be needed for new programs for High School Computers Science course or an in-school suspension program at the middle school level.

While enrollment is declining, enrollment in Special Education is picking up. Special Education programs are more expensive and these classes are projected to gain 107 students, totaling 766 of the 16,600 students. Special Education costs are slated to add \$340,000 to the Budget.

Regarding out-of-school placement, for each student an individual educational plan is developed. We are mandated by law to educate children from age 3 to 21, or until an High School <u>Dipolma</u> is earned. Each year over 175 students have educational programs implemented in out-of-district location. This involves tuition and transportation to State and private schools.

Class sizes will average 21 in elementary schools, 25 in middle schools and anywhere from 19 to 28 in the High Schools.

The original figure of \$41,446,000 reduced by the Board of Finance cut of \$905,000 minus the teachers' wage increases and adjustments by contracts of \$1,700,000 and the Fiscal Committee's cut of \$100,000. it leaves the Board of Education with \$454,780 more than last year's budget, which is just a little bit over 1.63% of last year's budget.

MR. DeLUCA: Considering a 739 student decrease at a cost of \$2,300 per student, a budget cut of at least \$1,699,070 should be made. A cut of this size is reasonable in light of the enrollment decrease, our students can and still continue to receive a triple A rating and education. Therefore I make a motion to cut \$1,279,700 from this budget.

MR. FOX: A motion has been made, and seconded. The MOTION WAS LOST, 26 No; 10 yes; (3 absent)

MR. ZELINSKI: I would like to recommend a cut of \$457,357 from the present Board of Education budget. I am told the cost per student is \$2,100 in the regular classes, for Special Education it would be between \$4,500 and \$5,000. Multiplying that 500 less students that are projected or could be projected in this budget for 1979/80 times the cost per pupil gives me a figure of \$1,050,000. Cutting out the Staff Development in the amount of \$307,357 in addition to the \$1,050,000 for a total of \$1,357,357 would be the total cut I'm looking for, however being the Board of Finance has already cut \$900,000 from the budget, that leaves me a balance of \$457,357. Based on the over estimate projection and cutting of Staff Development, I think in all fairness to the Board of Education and to the taxpayers, an additional \$457,357 is reasonable and realistic.

MR. FOX: A motion made by Mr. Zelinski to cut the Board of Education budget an additional \$457,357. It's been moved and seconded. The MOTION is LOST. 13 Yes; 24 No; (2 Absent). (1 vacancy)

MR. BLUM: I would like to put a motion before the Board. Hearing what I did from Mr. Flounders and many others, I would like to place a motion that we cut \$50,000 from the Board of Education budget.

MR. FOX: The motion you are making, Mr. Blum, is in effect to restore \$50,000 of the cut that is recommended by the Fiscal Committee. It has been moved and seconded. The MOTION is LOST, 16 Yes; 20 No; 1 Abstain (2 Absent).(1 vacancy)

MR. BOCCUZZI: I'm going to take one more crack at this. I move we reduce the budget by a total of \$300,000.

MR. FOX: A motion has been made, moved and seconded. The MOTION is LOST, 16 Yes; 21 No; (2 absent). (1 vacancy)

MR. VENTURA: I'dlike to make a motion that we honor the Fiscal Committee's recommendation to cut the \$100,000.

MR. FOX: I don't feel that would be appropriate; that motion is the motion which Mrs. Goldstein has previously made; it is on the floor, it's a continuing motion.

MR. FERRARA: I'd like to make a motion to cut the Board of Education budget by \$200,000.

MR. FOX: MOVED, SECONDED, THE MOTION is LOST. There is a continuing motion that will continue all evening until we finally adopt the Resolution sometime this evening or tomorrow evening. When there are no further motions, if there are no further motions that are made and passed other than the one that is pending, then that is approved.

MR. ESPOSITO: As I recall we ran into this problem last year. We could go on all night. On that basis, I move that we recommend a cut of \$97,000.

MR. FOX: MOVED AND SECONDED.

MR. BAXTER: I move to amend the motion on the floor for a cut of \$99,999.99.

MR. FOX: The procedure that we have been following in my experience in dealing with the budgets, Mr. Baxter, we don't make a motion to amend the motion. We have a pending motion to cut it \$97,000 depending upon what happens to that motion, you would then be free to make another motion if you so desire.

MR. BAXTER: It like to point out that it seems the clear will of this Board to have a \$100,000 cut and the only thing that is stopping us is some procedural difficulty and I don't think that should stop us. What happens if he had said instead of 97,000., \$96,000 or \$95,000.?

MR. FOX: Then that particular motion would be approved.

MR. ESPOSITO: If it would help matters, I'll withdraw my motion.

MR. VENTURA: Mr. President I'dlike to make a motion that we cut \$101,000.

MR. FOX: A motion made by Mr. Ventura to cut the Board of Education budget \$101,000. MOVED AND SECONDED. The MOTION IS CARRIED, 27 Yes; 7 No; 3 Abstentions; (2 absent; 1 vacant seat).

-The President declares a recess which lasted from 10:30 to 10:45 P.M.
