

**SENSE OF THE BOARD RESOLUTION
THANKING JACK CONDLIN ON 20 YEARS AS
PRESIDENT AND CEO OF THE STAMFORD CHAMBER OF COMMERCE
AND CONGRATULATING HIM ON HIS RETIREMENT**

WHEREAS, John P. "Jack" Condlin has served for the past 20 years as President and CEO of Stamford Chamber of Commerce and has announced his retirement; and

WHEREAS, Jack Condlin helped to found the Stamford Chamber of Commerce in 1987 and became President of the Stamford Chamber of Commerce in 1998; and

WHEREAS, prior to joining the Chamber of Commerce, Jack Condlin served as Executive Director of the Stamford Urban Renewal Commission and was Executive Vice-President and COO of Marlo Associates; and

WHEREAS, during his tenure with the Chamber of Commerce, Jack Condlin increased membership from 500 to more than 1600 business and professional firms in Stamford; and

WHEREAS, Jack Condlin created initiatives that helped make Stamford what it is today, including promoting Stamford's workforce, improving transportation in Stamford, working with the city on small business initiatives, and creating an international council for those Stamford businesses doing business overseas, and

WHEREAS, Jack Condlin's efforts extended to helping the Stamford community at large, including partnering with U.S. Computer Connection LLC to create the TechCycle program, which provides recycled computers to the families of 3rd grade students in Stamford, creating Kids our Future, a fundraising vehicle associated with the Chamber to aid the Stamford school system, and teaching classes related to Civic Engagement, Engineering and College Readiness to eighth to eleventh graders; and

WHEREAS, Jack Condlin worked with Connecticut Transit to coordinate timing of the buses with arrival times of trains to promote mass transit, and created the Center for Globalization as a joint venture with UConn; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the 30th Stamford Board of Representatives extends their sincere thanks and appreciation to Jack Condlin on 20 years as President and CEO of the Stamford Chamber of Commerce and congratulates him on his retirement.
