

**ORDINANCE NO. 1133 AMENDING  
SECTION 231-8 OF THE STAMFORD CODE OF ORDINANCES, REMOVAL OR  
IMMOBILIZATION OF MOTOR VEHICLES  
BEARING OUTSTANDING CITATIONS**

**WHEREAS**, it has been determined that §231-8 of the City of Stamford Code of Ordinances should be amended in order to reduce the number of outstanding parking violations from six to three to trigger removal or immobilization of a motor vehicle.

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED IN THE CITY OF STAMFORD THAT:**

Section 231-8(a) of the City of Stamford Code of Ordinances is amended as follows:

**Sec. 231-8. Removal or immobilization of motor vehicles bearing outstanding citations.**

A. Whenever there is found any motor vehicle parked upon the streets or public grounds of the city which has received ~~six~~ **three (3)** or more parking citations issued for a violation of any provision of §231-5 or 231-6 of this Article which are delinquent, unpaid or otherwise unsettled and uncontested, such vehicle shall, by towing or otherwise, upon approval of the traffic authority or his/her designee, be removed for safekeeping, by or under the direction of a police officer, traffic violations officer or other individual empowered by the traffic authority, to a garage or other location, or such vehicle may be immobilized in such a manner as to prevent its removal or operation except by persons as shall be authorized to do so by the traffic authority.

This ordinance shall take effect upon its enactment.
